 - Addition to the UCTC Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2017-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for Illustrative Purposes to Add New NYSDOT PIN 817750. New York State Department of Transportation has requested that UCTC add a new project to the 2017 Transportation Improvement Program for illustrative purposes. The project will return a segment of United States Route 209 pavement from New York State Route 52 to the bridge over the Rondout Creek, a length of 1.8 miles, to good condition by removing the existing surface for a depth of between 1" and 1 1/2" and replacing it with new hot mix asphalt. The project is located in the Village of Ellenville and the Town of Wawarsing in Ulster County. The total project cost is \$1.760; 100% state funding through NYS PIT Bond (NYS Revenue Bond). The project does not utilize federal funding and therefore does not require an amendment; action is for illustrative purposes only to facilitate project tracking. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Document Narrative to Revise Table 1: TIP

Amendment and Modification Procedures to Clarify Amendment Process with Regard to

New Projects as Shown in Attachment 1. UCTC TIP Amendment and Modification

procedures are outlined in the TIP narrative section of the document under Table 1. As

presently written, new projects to be added to the TIP require UCTC Technical Committee

review and approval, 15 day public notice and comment period, and final review and approval

by the UCTC Policy Committee before they can be approved by staff. This process is intended

to provide a level of detailed oversight and transparency regarding the use of federal, state and

local funds on transportation projects. Under specific circumstances, certain TIP actions that

are presently required to have a full Amendment many not warrant such a detailed level of

scrutiny. Those instances include: a) Assignment of new projects that are already included on
an approved TIP/STIP, such as block program funds that are later assigned to specific projects
and schedules; b) Multi-county funds that are later assigned to a specific project, location,
budget and schedule; and c) Projects requested to be added to the TIP for illustrative purposes

only. In light of these instances, it is proposed that the UCTC TIP Amendment and Modification Procedures be amended to allow UCTC staff to program such changes administratively. Under UCTC Operating Procedures, amendments to the TIP, including those to the narrative section of the document, must be recommended by the UCTC Technical Committee and are subject to 15 day public review and comment period prior to final consideration by the UCTC Policy Committee.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: Discuss the Draft Resolution 2017-13 and consider releasing details for 15 day public review and comment period prior to forwarding to the Policy Committee for consideration and adoption (20 minutes).

c) NYSDOT Pedestrian Safety Action Plan Call for Local Projects. The New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) is pleased to progress the local call for pedestrian safety projects included in the Statewide Pedestrian Safety Action Plan (PSAP) that was announced in June of 2016. The local call for pedestrian safety projects includes \$40,000,000 in federal Highway Safety Improvement Program funds for systemic pedestrian safety projects on local and county urban roads and streets. NYSDOT will host a webinar on November 14, 2017 from 2:00-3:30 to answer questions about the program and the application process. Additional information about the webinar, program guidance, how to apply, application forms and related materials is available at https://www.dot.ny.gov/divisions/operating/osss/highway/psap.

Applications must be submitted by March 09, 2018. Eligible projects must be on a public road, off the state touring route system and be on a local or county owned or maintained road. All project locations must be on roads that are located within a designated 2010 federal adjusted urban area. NYSDOT and UCTC staff will provide a brief presentation addressing the PSAP program and answer any questions that members may have.

d) 2018/19 UPWP Development/Call for Projects: Staff will begin developing the 2018/19 Unified Planning Work Program in December. A summary of the status of consultant-based studies is included in the agenda supplement for member reference. Members are encouraged to discuss possible projects for inclusion in the 2018/19 UPWP.

Recommended Action: For information purposes only (15 minutes).

e) Mid-Hudson Transportation Management Area 2017 Federal Certification Review. Staff will provide members with a summary of the Federal Certification Review that took place in September of this year. the primary purpose of a certification review is to formalize the continuing oversight and day-to-day evaluation of the planning process. The certification review process ensures that the planning requirements of 23 U.S.C. 134 and 49 U.S.C. 5303 are being satisfactorily implemented. In a broader sense, the certification review process is a valuable opportunity to provide advice and guidance to a Transportation Management Area (TMA), defined as an urbanized area with a population over 200,000, for enhancing the planning process and improving the quality of transportation investment decisions. Results of this review are not expected to be provided until later in 2018.

Recommended Action: For information purposes only (15 minutes).

f) UCTC 2017 Transportation Improvement Program – Block Program Bridge and Paving PINs. The 2017 – 2021 TIP included two new "block program" PINs utilizing surplus allocations of STP FLEX and STBG Off-System Bridge funds. Funds in FFYs 17 & 18 were distributed last

year. UCTC plans to make funds in FFYs 19 & 20 available to eligible Ulster County municipalities through direct solicitation to the MPO. UCTC will provide an overview of the funds available and answer any questions members may have. No deadline for applications has been established at this time.
