Proposed Amendment to the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2023-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

The Ulster County Transportation Council (UCTC) has initiated a 15 day public comment period on proposed amendments to the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2023-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Transportation Improvement Program

The TIP is a five-year capital program that assigns federal funds to transportation projects located in Ulster County. The proposed amendments to the TIP are as follows:

- ▶ **Resolution 2025-13:** Amendment to the UCTC Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2023 – 2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to Add NYSDOT Project PIN 8LC231 – Rehabilitate several culverts carrying NY Routes 28, 213, 299 and US Route 209 over streams and improving resilience to extreme weather events.
Sponsor: NYSDOT
Total Project Cost: \$8.049m
